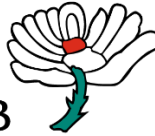

PAULINE BEESLEY

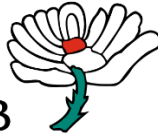
Having been a member of the Members' Representative Group ("MRG") since 2018, I have seen significant changes enacted at the Club as a direct result of the MRG's important role.

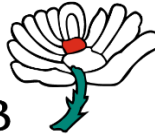

Professionally, I built an accomplished career in the events and hospitality industry, working with high-profile clients across government and the corporate sector. I spent almost 40 years as a sports journalist, firstly on newspapers like the Yorkshire Evening Post, Halifax Chronicle and Harrogate Advertiser before moving into TV.

During two years as a sports reporter on YTV's Calendar programme and 15 years as a freelance reporter for Sky Sports News, I covered, amongst other things, county and international cricket as well as football and rugby league.

I was at North Marine Road and The Oval on the days Yorkshire won the County Championship in 2001 and England regained The Ashes in 2005. I view these as two of my favourite sporting moments.

Whilst other Sky Sports reporters tended to be focused on football, I liked nothing better than a day reporting on County Championship cricket, preferably at Headingley or Scarborough.

Away from work, I am a UKCC Level 2 cricket coach and was instrumental in setting up the junior section at Olicanian CC in Ilkley where I was a Trustee and committee man for more than 30 years.

As the U9's team manager, I coached Harry Brook during his first season of junior league cricket. Two years later, I was the U9's coach when George Hill joined the club.

I have been delighted to see Harry and George develop from gifted seven-year-olds into an international batter and a classy all-rounder and I am interested to see how paceman Alex Wade, the latest OCC junior to sign a pro contract with the county, fares over time.

Whilst I will be coaching Menston CC's Under 11's this summer, I also want to make a contribution at county level.

If elected to the Members' Representative Group, I hope my knowledge of the grassroots game in the county may be helpful in trying to find ways to get more young cricketers, their parents and club cricketers to county games.
