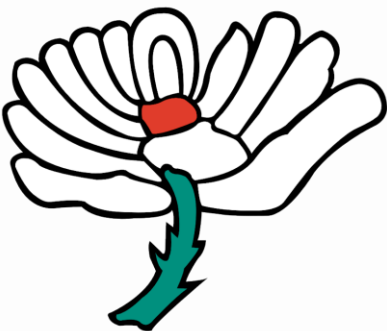


FAMILY CODE OF CONDUCT



The purpose of this Family Code of Conduct is to remind families of the standards of behaviour expected to best support your child on the Yorkshire CCC Pathway. This selective, elite programme provides a high-quality, supportive environment where young cricketers can develop their skills, character and love for the game.

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Encourage independence: Let your child carry their own kit and take responsibility on match days and at training;• Be prepared and punctual: Ensure your child has the correct kit, protective equipment, food and drink. Arrive on time and collect promptly;• Focus on effort and growth, not just results: Celebrate hard work and learning moments as much as winning;• Support professional coaching decisions: Accept the coach's judgment on playing time, positions and tactics; and• Help your child embrace ambition and accountability: Encourage them to set goals and take ownership of their development.		<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Stay in the right areas:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Do not enter changing rooms• Do not enter the field of play• Encourage your child to remain with the team during matches• Support positively from the sidelines:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Celebrate effort and good play from both teams• Avoid negative comments or sideline coaching• Back the team and coaching staff: Avoid interfering with coaches' duties and responsibilities; and• Share relevant information: Notify coaches promptly of any injury, illness, concussion or personal pressures affecting your child and keep all consent and medical forms up to date.

<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Respect the rights, dignity, and worth of all others involved in the Pathway;• Promote sportsmanship and fairness:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Encourage your child to play by the rules and respect umpires' decisions• Remind your child to treat teammates, opponents, and officials with respect• Avoid bringing Yorkshire Cricket, the ECB or the game into disrepute; and• Act in line with our Pathway Policies, Guidance and Procedures, namely our Safeguarding Policy.		<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Trust the elite programme process: Understand that this pathway prepares players for the next level;• Communicate in line with our <i>Communications Protocol</i>:<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Avoid approaching coaches during training or games except in emergencies; and• Encourage boldness in your child: Support them in trying new skills and learning from mistakes without fear.	

BREACHES OF THIS CODE OF CONDUCT

1. The issue will be addressed constructively and promptly;
2. Families may be asked to leave a session or match;
3. A report will be made to the Cricket Regulator documenting this behaviour as a Low-Level Concern (LLC);
4. Persistent breaches may result in suspension from attending matches or training;
5. Continued issues may lead to the cricketer being withdrawn from the Pathway; and/or
6. The Club may contact appropriate authorities (in cases of criminal behaviour and/or safeguarding risk).
