ROLE SUMMARY

Role title: Sport Psychologist

Reports to: Head of Science and Medicine

Based at: Headingley Cricket Ground (with regular travel required)

Salary: £40,000 - £45,000

Employment Type: Permanent – Full time (Potential for part-time options)

Job purpose:

The Sport Psychologist will provide performance psychology plus mental health and wellbeing support services to the Yorkshire County Cricket Club's players across Men's and Women's Senior and Academy programmes. This role will aim to maximise player mental wellbeing, agility, resilience and skill execution. This role is required to provide support all year round and will require attendance at both home and away matches.

The role does require extended hours and regular travel throughout the UK during the County season (April-September) which will include working on weekends and Bank holidays. There may be requirement to attend an overseas tour during the off-season (October-March).

KEY RESPONSIBILITIES

Sport Psychology Support

Lead Psychology services across the club, including Senior and Academy teams for Men and Women.

Sport Psychology Delivery

Deliver using a variety of education / intervention modalities, including one-to-one and group sessions.

Player Profiling & Screening

Complete player profiling / screening, in line with YCCC and ECB protocols, to inform individualised support, management and skill development strategies.

Health and Wellbeing Support

Attend, coordinate and contribute within the club's Wellbeing Forum, alongside CMO, Clinical Psychologist and HoSM.

Wider MDT Support

Coordinate with the rest of the MDT in identifying the specific needs and strategies for individual development and elite skill performance, as well as coordinating effective mental health, wellbeing and safeguarding support.

Continuous Innovation & Development

Undertake appropriate professional development to keep abreast of world's best practice and current evidence-based research in cricket.

SKILLS AND EXPERIENCE

- Undergraduate or Postgraduate degree in Psychology (BSc / MSc)
- Current Health Care Professions Council (HCPC) accreditation (or working towards via BASES / SEPAR with HCPC accreditation date set for 2026).
- Minimum of 1-2 years post-graduate experience in the provision of psychology services within elite sport.
- Excellent communication and interpersonal skills with previous experience of working collaboratively in a professional sports environment.
- Demonstrate experience and/or commitment to safeguarding and welfare requirements.
- Good understanding of operating within an Equality, Diversity and Inclusion (EDI) framework.



PERSONAL ATTRIBUTES

The role will require a committed individual with a passion for elite sports performance able to demonstrate versatile communication, relationship building and excellent clinical practices to work across Yorkshire's playing staff from young, aspiring cricketers to senior internationals.

The department's philosophy requires practitioners to be team orientated and willing to commit to this high potential project.

As well as possessing the required skills and experience, you will demonstrate an alignment to the Club vision, mission statement and values.
